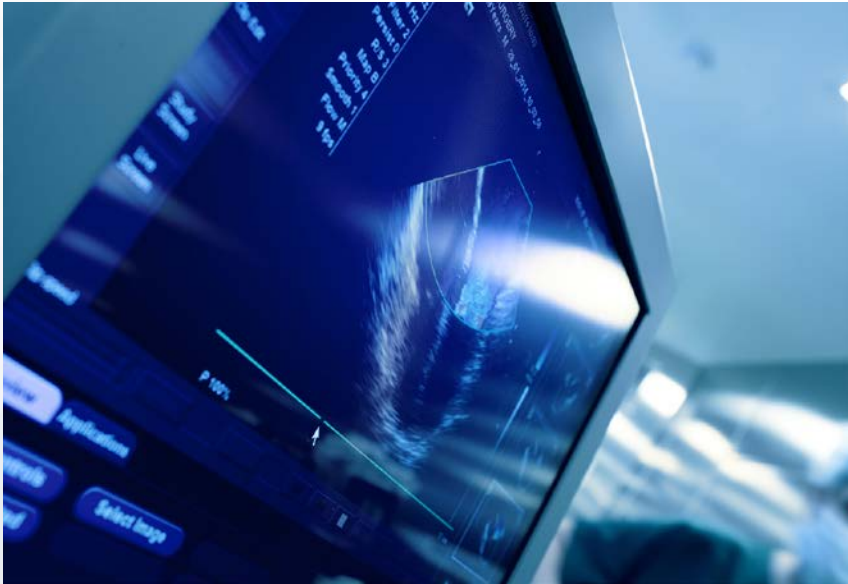
Implementation of the Water & Land Conservation Constitutional Amendment: HB 989 (SB 1168)

Termination of Pregnancies: HB 1411 (SB

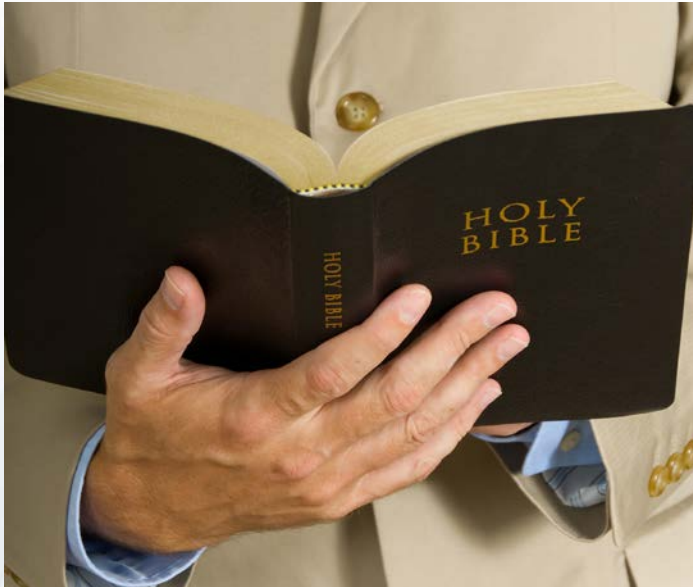

Safeguards women's health and guards **against** taxpayer funded abortion.

Pastor Protection: HB 43 (SB 110)

Protects religious freedom as guaranteed by the United States Constitution, the Florida Constitution, and the Florida Religious Freedom Restoration Act (FRFRA)



Provides an extra layer of protection for religious organizations by codifying their existing right to be free from the government compelling them to engage in conduct their religion forbids.

General Appropriations Act: HB 5001

Balanced budget:

\$557 million in tax relief

\$3 billion in reserves

Unprecedented K-12
per student funding



School Choice: HB 7029



Increases options that **allow parents to choose** the educational environment that best suits their child's abilities and goals.

Tax Relief Package: HB 7099

\$1 Billion in tax relief over the last two years

Reduces property tax millage, while increasing funds for K-12 education

3-Day Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday

Permanently eliminates the sales tax on manufacturing machinery and equipment



Public Corruption: HB 7071 (SB 582)



Strengthens Florida's ethics laws and holds government, and those who contract with the government, accountable to taxpayers.
